JANUARY PROGRAM

Rose Wathen will show us how to letter on glass. This is a great way to make gifts or decorate for any occasion, from personalized glasses for friends to mirrored seating charts for weddings and everything in between. Rose will be demonstrating on clear glass and a mirror. Each project has its own obstacles!

Hand mirror or bigger mirror
Any flat glass that is smooth
A drinking glass that is smooth
A window pane
Note: All items to be painted should be cleaned with windex before the program.

Ideas for glass items:

If you have a ruler, posca pens or other acrylic paint pens, please bring. Also, you will need pencil and paper a little bigger than your item that you will be lettering on.

2023 CAC EXHIBITION - FEBRUARY 2 - MARCH 23, 2023

Our Centennial Art Center (CAC) show of 2023 is just a couple weeks away. Every member is invited to submit their work for the show and we welcome all as 40-50 pieces are needed. The sale of artwork is strongly encouraged. CAC retains 30% of the sales price. I will be at the January 14th guild meeting to collect your pieces then and bring them to CAC. If you cannot attend, let me know and other arrangements can be made.

Here are details to keep in mind:

I need your release form (email is OK) by **January 14th** in order to make wall tags and a gallery list. The release form and labels for each piece are included in this newsletter. All work must have a wire for hanging and a label on the back with your name and title of the piece. [Ed. note: Release form and tags are on page 8 of this newsletter.]

If not given to me (Valerie), artwork must be delivered to Centennial Art Center **January 18th or 19th** between the hours of 10 AM and 4 PM. Keep in mind that they close at 4 PM.

To protect your work, please wrap it carefully and include your name and title of the piece on the wrapping.

There will be an opening reception on Friday, **February 3rd** from 5:00-7:30 PM. This is always a fun evening and guests enjoy talking to the artists about their work. I hope you will plan to attend!

Artwork must be picked up on Monday, **March 23rd** between 10AM and 4PM. If you cannot pick up your piece(s), I will get them for you.

If there are any questions, email me or one of the other officers and we will be happy to help.

Lettering Project for 2023

I hope you have been able to keep up with your Letter a Week Project for 2022. Remember that we will be displaying them at our January Guild meeting.

For 2023, we will change up our projects a bit. We will be doing a Word of the Month. Here are the simple rules:

- 1. 3" x 5" paper of your choice -- colored, plain white or black, handmade, your choice.
- 2. Create the assigned word in any calligraphic style you like, embellish it, flourish it, emboss it -- make it yours.
- 3. List tools and materials on the back side of the paper.

We will be creating a handmade book at the end of this 2+ year project in which you will place your words. So keep that in mind as you choose a color scheme.

Sound like fun? Feel free to join us on this journey. Go back to hands that you have learned since Covid sidelined us all or hands that you studied in live workshops -- any hands that you like. This is your opportunity to be creative.

Your first two words are: January 2023 -- Awesome February 2023 -- Bloom

the meeting room with magnificent views of the lake.



Layout and Design for Caligraphers

Ok, so you've taken a few lettering classes and have a few hands under your belt. Great! But what's next? You've seen all the



beautiful work in the lettering magazines and the art exhibits and wonder, "Will I ever be able to do that?!" The answer is "Yes!" and this class will show you how.

Using favorite tools and a favorite quote, students will be led through a series of exercises that will focus not only on the lettering but on

layout, composition, and the negative space that is created. Principles of graphic design will be introduced as we discuss where the next letter or word should go; where and when to apply color; and the steps it takes to get to a finished piece.

We will use the favorite tools to work with black on white, white on black, walnut and sumi inks, and watercolors, as well as different papers.

Refining Your Italic

For the last several years, we have seen a resurgence in "calligraphy", thanks to modern variations on pointed pen lettering. Unfortunately, the more traditional broad-edge letterforms seem to have taken a backseat. One of the most beautiful and versatile broad-edge alphabets is Italic.



As many of you know, I love Italic; but no matter how much we love any letterform, our interest in the basics wanes. We begin to take what we think we know for granted, and we may become sloppy in our approach. This fuels dissatisfaction with our work and disenchantment with the letterform itself.

> Does this sound familiar? If so, grab your pens and spend a weekend revisiting and refining your italic or possibly visiting



Wrappings that are clearly marked with your name will make it easier to return your artwork to you in the original packaging. All work must have an entry label firmly attached to the back of the piece. A duplicate label must be submitted to complete the gallery list. All artists must submit a signed release form which lists the titles of any pieces submitted. The Nashville Calligrapher's Guild reserves the right to refuse inappropriate pieces. IAMPETH Update


Plans are quickly moving forward for IAMPETH 2023. The registration information will be available to current members in mid January.
