
Letter A Week Project


IAMPETH CONFERENCE...

The annual IAMPTH (International Association of Master Penmen, Engrossers, and Teachers of Handwriting) Conference was held in Atlanta, Georgia, from July 11 - 16, 2022. Here are reviews of the classes and photos of artwork of this year's conference from the attendees.

Review from Carol Hall

IAMPETH proved to be a rewarding experience for me, returning to an in-person conference after a few years' hiatus. Here is s sampling of work I did in Schin Loong's class on Calligraphic Animals, Suzanne Cunningham's inventive script called Imperial, and Barbara Close's Watercolor Garden.





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Review from Ann Cobb

IAMPETH 2022 saw 317 members gather at the Grand Hyatt Hotel in Buckhead, Atlanta, Georgia. The staff at the hotel was wonderful – some of the most courteous and professional people in the industry.

My Tuesday was spent with Bob Hurford and Neil McCaffery leading us through various pieces in the Archives collection. Bob talked about several of the pieces. The rest of the day we were free to examine the pieces closely and ask any questions that we had. IAMPETH's Archives collection is stored in a salt mine is Kansas when it is not on display at our annual conference.



One of the treats of this session was a complete book of hours brought to conference by one of our members, and shared in the Archives room the full week.

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Wednesday was spent with Rich and Vivian Mungall sharing their World of Engrossing. Vivian has worked as an Engrosser for almost 40 years. They shared their processes, procedures, and techniques for creating manuscripts, certificates, resolutions, and a wealth of other documents. They brought 11 scrapbooks from the collections of Frederick Tamblyn and Stephen Ziller. The piece below is a portion of an advertisement for the Tamblyn Studio.




Thursday was spent Playing with Gold! Dan Mooney led our session as we created a piece with both flat and raised gilding. Dan uses Ormoline for his flat gilding, and Instacoll for his raised gilding. His work is absolutely stunning! My sample from his class is far from being finished – you will see it later. But below are two of Dan's pieces for you to enjoy. You can also expect to see these techniques demonstrated some time later in the year.




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Friday was spent with Marie Hornback studying Handwriting. Marie is director of the American Cursive Instructor Certification Program and teaches handwriting to students in her local elementary school. We studied handwriting systems of Behrensmeyer, Mills, Palmer, and Mary Champion.



Saturday's half-day class was spent with Janet Takahashi, working with limited watercolor palettes. Janet prepared for us dot cards in Neutrals, Delicates, Southwest, Brights, and Renaissance colors. Janet's watercolor work is some of the best anywhere, and her mastery of color palettes is magical.



At Saturday evening's closing banquet, it was my honor to be inducted as President of IAMPETH for the next year. Our Conference will be in Scranton, Pennsylvania. The Conference logo is an adaptation of a P. W. Costello design, edited with the permission of P. W.'s great grandson, Tom Costello.

WORKSHOP REVIEW


The International Lettering Conference of 2021 was all virtual and they have extended the classes for another year, so I took advantage of the opportunity to take the Visigothic Versals by Risa Gettler. This medieval script was used from the late 7th century to the 13th century in Visigothic Iberia (modern Spain and Portugal).

This is a very versatile hand to work with. The letters are done with a pointed pen (I used a Micron.) and the weight of the stroke is added afterward. There are no miniscules and each letter can vary according to what fits best. Therein lies the challange!

The process for creating a piece is simple. The quote or poem is written out normallly. Then, the lines are adjusted so that all are the same length by changing each letter in size or style, sometimes combining strokes. The vowels are usually the first ones to adjust but D's, H's, N's and T's work well too. You do have to be aware of the way some letters are combined. For instance, if the O is put on the first stroke of the N, it was be the word ON but if the O is joined on the last stroke of the N, it would be the word NO.

It sounds complicated but it is actually a fun alphabet to use and one that I will be using for my more whimsical quotes and poems.
