Workshop Information

Workshops are open initially to Nashville Calligraphers Guild members. If spaces are available one month prior to the workshop dates, registration is open to non-members.

Workshops are planned based upon survey results from the Guild Workshop Survey, done every other year. Teachers and/or workshop topics that are suggested by members are investigated and may be booked if the workshop is one that was mentioned frequently in the surveys. We must schedule workshops that are of interest to the most members possible. Otherwise, we do not meet minimum workshop numbers. Workshop teachers must often be booked two years ahead due to the teachers' calendars. Many are now booking two or more years out.

We try to make workshops affordable to our members; thus, we often schedule two one-day workshops taught by local guild members, and two two-day workshops at least one of which is taught by an out-of-town teacher. Thank you for your support of our workshops and our Guild.

Join The NCG Summer Envelope Exchange!

The theme is: Walking on Sunshine

The exchange will run from **June through August**, 2020.

How it works:

By signing up, you are committing to send approximately *six* envelopes:
two envelopes in June, two in July, and two in August.
You are asked to bring the envelopes you receive to the September Guild meeting to show and share!
You will be placed on a list with approximately six other Guild members.
Your list will be emailed (or via postal mail) to you no later than June 1.
The deadline to sign up is May 15, 2020.

Participants agree to let the recipients of their envelopes share the envelopes with anyone to whom they will show them in person. The envelopes cannot be placed on any web site or printed in any format without the written permission of the sender. Participants do, however, by virtue of participating, grant permission for Beth Paul, the newsletter editor, to publish pictures of envelopes in the Guild newsletter.

Remember this is a calligraphic exchange.

You can add any design features that you wish, but the lettering should be the focus. You do not need to put anything calligraphic into your envelope. You can if you wish, but no pressure to do so. You must put something into your envelope -- perhaps a short note telling something about yourself, or share the techniques used to address the envelope.

Love Letters and Elvis!

Normally, I just randomly call members to interview. However, since I've procrastinated too long (down to the last 24 hours) to take a chance, AND I had to talk to Chris Hackenbrack....so she became my interviewee!!!

So after taking care of business (one of Elvis' favorite sayings), we started the interview. But first, I learned that, as a child, Chris lived in Orlando BEFORE Disney World. (And we think Nashville has changed in the last few years!!!) As one of four children, all close in age, add in their friends, their house with a back yard pool seemed like a constant pool party. Being on a swim team, Chris and her sister were offered a job at Sea World as a 'pearl divers'! The drive was too long (45 minutes) so she took a job in a mall. But wouldn't 'Pearl Diver' be great on a resumé? As an adult she moved to the beach in Gainesville, Florida.

How long have you been doing calligraphy? Introduced in 8th grade- she had half a semester calligraphy class with a broad pen. The pen was put down, untill 5 years ago. Chris was addressing her Christmas cards and wanted them to be pretty. So she found the Guild, came to a November meeting and was convinced to go to Scribehaven in February! At Scribehaven Sheryl Bracey shared exemplars for English Roundhand... And she was off to the races, so to speak.

What's your go-to book? Molly Suber Thrope's *Modern Calligraphy* and *Mastering Modern Calligraphy* as well as *The Calligrapher's Business Handbook*.

Who do you follow on Instagram? She laughed- seems like 100s! She started with the Happy Ever Crafter on YouTube, where a new person was interviewed every week then Chris would follow that person, so the list grew weekly. More often than not, these people all followed Chris back and she interacts with them. Also, she follows Lindsey's and The Postman's Knock, which is also an email. But not all are calligraphers. James Clear, author of Atomic Habits, tiny changes remarkable results.... sounds really good for me!!!!

Favorite tip? Don't use a plastic pen holder. AND take a class with Sheryl Bracey!

NCG MEMBER INTERVIEW: CHRIS HACKENBRACK

Start with classic English Roundhand before going to modern calligraphy. You can tell when people don't!

Good handwriting in school? Yes! In parochial school, they weren't allowed ballpoint pens, just fountain pens. (Have you also read that ballpoint pens have ruined our handwriting since the two pens are held differently? Chris, thank your school every day!)
*Favorite hand? (best answer ever!) "My own!"
*Least favorite? Broad edge. She likes looking at the hands, just not writing them.

What's your studio like? It's a front bedroom, with a wonderful window and an attached bathroom. Two lingerie dressers (great with their smaller drawers), bookcases and a desk. On the wall is a painting of Elvis (by Chris), and standing nearby is a life size Elvis!

Other passions? Family. Knitting. Dancing. In fact, she and her husband went on a swing dance week honeymoon. Besides dancing in the house, she does exercise dance class too. Her grandparents were from Croatia, which means music and dancing. So every Sunday, she and her family would dance around a pole (not to be confused with a pole dancer). Another passion is, of course, water color painting. If it stands still, she will paint on it - furniture, walls, canvases, cards, etc. While her kids were in school, she painted murals in the schools! She painted walls in her mother's home.... an 18 inch high "aquarium' in a bathroom that goes all around the room, with fish and a dolphin....artistic liberty!

Favorite quote? Depends on her mood. She couldn't come up with one at the moment but said she goes to Pintrest for her hundreds she's saved. She uses these saved quotes often. Favorite tool? A paintbrush!!! Any kind!

Anything to add? Yes! "Because people find me from the 'love letters' cards, they often say how talented I am. But the fact is it is ALL practice, a lot of practice."
